BOND MARKET IN GOOD SHAPE

Communications received today from Sweet, Causey & Foster, Denver bond buyers, by City Manager F. J. Lafky, set out among other things that the bond market of the country is in first-class shape, and that municipal bonds generally are being disposed of readily enough. This concern negotiated with La Grande a short time back to take up serial bonds for the rehabilitation of the general fund. However, at that time the indebtedness was over \$100,000 and it is now down to \$65,000 or \$70,000 with prospects for material reduction shortly, and the bond people themselves, admit there is little or no use of floating bonds at this time, unless it might be on a small basis.

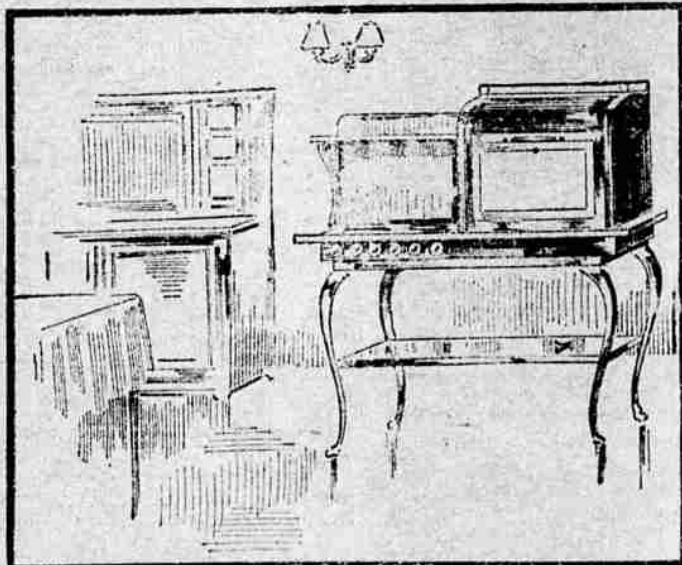
