### RABID HORSES DIE.

John Day Country Feels Effect of Rabid Coyotes in Horsebarns.

Pendleton, April 1.—"Two horses have already gone mad and been killed and I suppose others will die too."

The sentence is contained in a letter received by Douglas Belts from his son, Berne Belts, who is running stock on the middle fork of the John Day near Galena, relative to the rabies situation there. He tells of racing some pasture land to another man and it was this latter's horses that developed madness and died. Before dying, he writes, they bit a half dozen other horses and he expects these to become rabid too. Likewise some of his own cattle which strayed into the pasture.

This is only one of a number of recent reports coming from Grant county and the southern part of Umatilla county. Another story has it that a prominent rancher of the south end of the county has lost over 20 head of cattle by rabies, among them a valuable bull.

However, grave as the situation is and has been, stockmen believe the danger will be greatly reduced by the activity of coyote hunters who have been stimulated by the \$3 bounty law. Quite a number of men are making a business of hunting the animals now, it is reported, the pelts being worth \$1.50 in addition to the \$3 bounty. Every coyote killed decreases the danger and, when hunters bring in 40 hides at a time, it means that the reduction in the number of coyotes is a marked one.

### Horse Racing on the Streets

Baker March 31.—Residents of the east side report that sportily inclined horsemen of the city are making use of the streets in that section of town for race tracks and that hardly a day passes but what some contestants are proving the merits of their steeds by real warm contests. One well known rancher and another party were racing down one of the streets Monday having a tight struggle, when the rancher's opponent let his speeding animal get beyond control. The wagon was neatly wrapped around a telephone pole, throwing the driver some distance but inflicting no serious injuries. His opponent never stopped, according to witnesses.

### Knocked Senseless By Fall

Baker April 1.—While working yesterday morning on the roof of the new slaughter house in process of erection by the Smith Cast Market, south of the city, Chris Smith lost his footing and fell to the ground, knocked senseless by the impact. A taxi was summoned by his fellow workers and Smith was taken to his home at 1405 Second street. Although badly bruised by the fall, his injuries are not regarded as dangerous.
