SPELLING BEE REPEATED

Umatilla County Expects to Conduct Another Old-fashioned Spelling Bee. Pendleton April 1.—Umatilla county's second spelling bee will commence Friday in all sections of the county when the first of the two elimination contests will be held. At these contests a written examination will first be given to all grades from the third to the eighth inclusive and all classes averaging 80 per cent or better will be qualified to enter the oral examination on the same day. The oral examination will be between members of the class who have made an average in the written test as high or higher than the class average. This oral test will be continued until the two best spellers of the class are decided. On April 17 what is known as the division contest will be held. This will be an oral match between the representatives of the different classes chosen to the first elimination contest. Thus in Pendleton, where the district is composed of the Hawthorne, Washington and Lincoln schools, the division contests will be between two representatives of each grade of each school. There being the three schools, there will be six pupils in each contest and two of these will be selected to represent the district in the finals which are to be held in this city on May 1.
