MUTTON HOLDS FIRM GROUND

MUCH STRENGTH IS SEEN IN PORTLAND DEALS.

Other Grades of Meat Are Very Deceptive Generally.

Union Stockyards, Portland, April 6.—Prices in the cattle trade at North Portland are very deceptive. While an occasional sale of something selected is made as high as \$7.75, still the markets for tops cannot safely be placed above \$7.25@7.50, at the extreme. In fact, late yesterday afternoon some excellent grain fed steers were sold down to \$7.25, four loads going at that price.

Just a handful of mutton entered the yards at North Portland overnight. A few spring lambs were received and sold at \$10, a drop of \$1 from the former price. Very limited arrivals of spring lambs are expected within the immediate future, as advices from the country indicate that few are ready.

General conditions in the mutton trade are strong, with values well maintained.
