RAILROADERS ATTEND

Several From La Grande at Rounds Funeral in Pendleton.

Several La Grande railroaders are in Pendleton today to attend the funeral of F. P. Rounds, a veteran railroad, who was buried this afternoon.

Speaking of the death, the Pendleton East Oregonian says:

Death last evening just at 6 o'clock claimed Frank P. Rounds, well known resident of this city for many years and for the past quarter of a century the local foreman of the O.-W. R. & N. yards. His death followed a lingering illness of several years which had lately taken such a serious turn that the end had been expected for several days.

Deceased was 69 years, two months and 20 days old at the time of death, having been born in Iona county, Michigan, January 29, 1846. In 1863 when he was but 17 years old, he joined the Third Michigan infantry and served through the remainder of the Civil war and at its close being sent down into Mexico for a short time. When he retired from the army he was a second lieutenant.

At the conclusion of his soldiering, he entered the employ of the Grand Rapids and Indiana railroad and to the end of his life was engaged in this kind of work. He came west in 1886 and entered the employ of the O. R. & N. two later at The Dalles, remaining there two years before being transferred to Pendleton.

From 1890 until three months ago he acted as foreman of the local yards, rendering the company efficient service all of this time. Every railroad

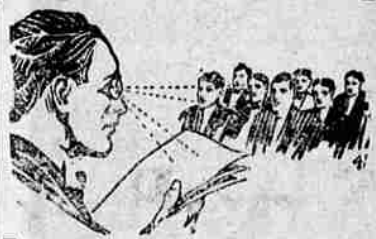
