TWO POUND ROLL OFFERED AT 55 CENTS

Radishes and Rhubarb Have Dropped In Price Too, Recently

Ranch butter is quoted at 55 cents to retailers today, the slump coming yesterday after creamery butter went down.

Vegetables, some of them at least, are also on the tobaggan, for radishes now sell at three bunches for 10 cents and rhubarb has fallen off another cent per pound.
