**War Oddities**

London, Apr. 15.—A British military bandman who suffered apoplexy when buried by a shell explosion at Ypres recovered his memory by reading a sheet of music placed on his bed.

Batavia, Apr. 15.—The commander in-chief of the army in the Dutch Indies has forbidden bands to play "It's a Long way to Tipperary." A recent report coming direct from Berlin declared the United States Consul-General had ordered menus from all Munich restaurants to send to America to disapprove German starvation newspaper reports printed them.
