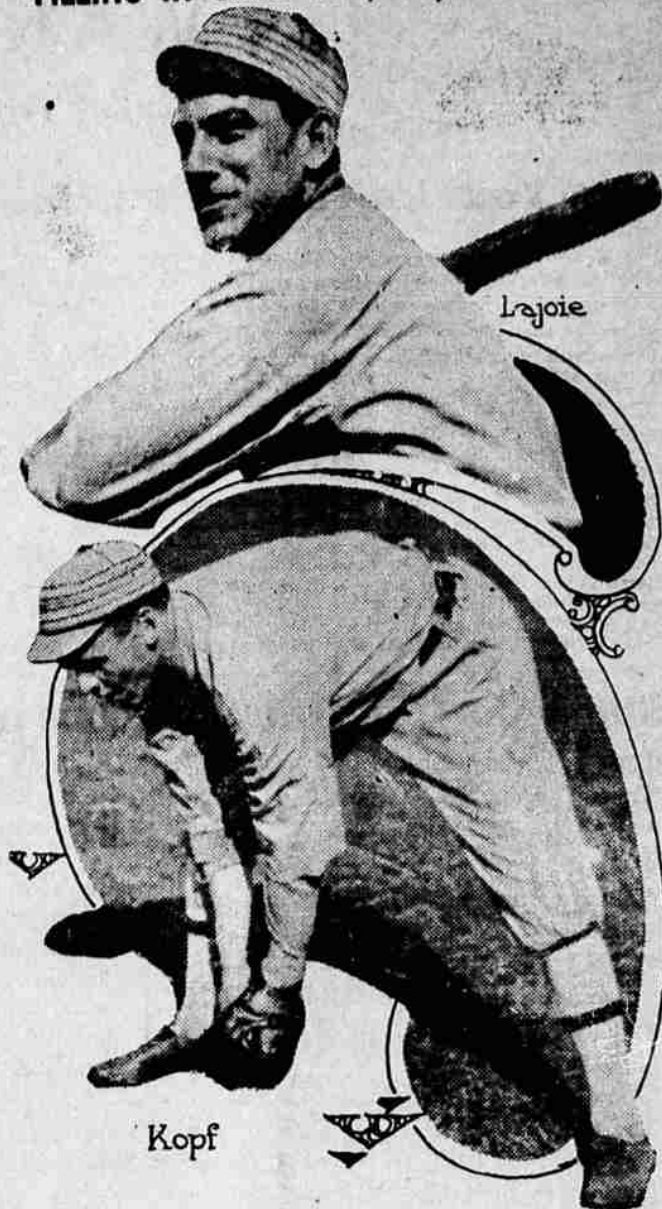

"Oh yes. I have gathered up all my old tin cans and thrown them on the neighbor's lot."

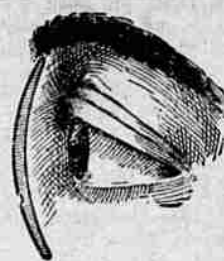
Next week is clean-up week. That means we will haul off the rubbish if properly boxed or sacked. Don't use wool sacks or piano boxes.

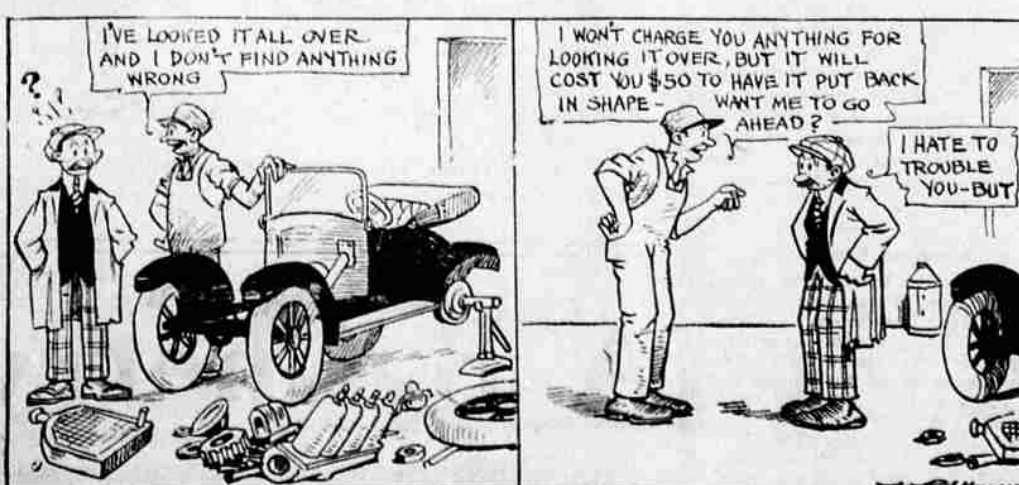
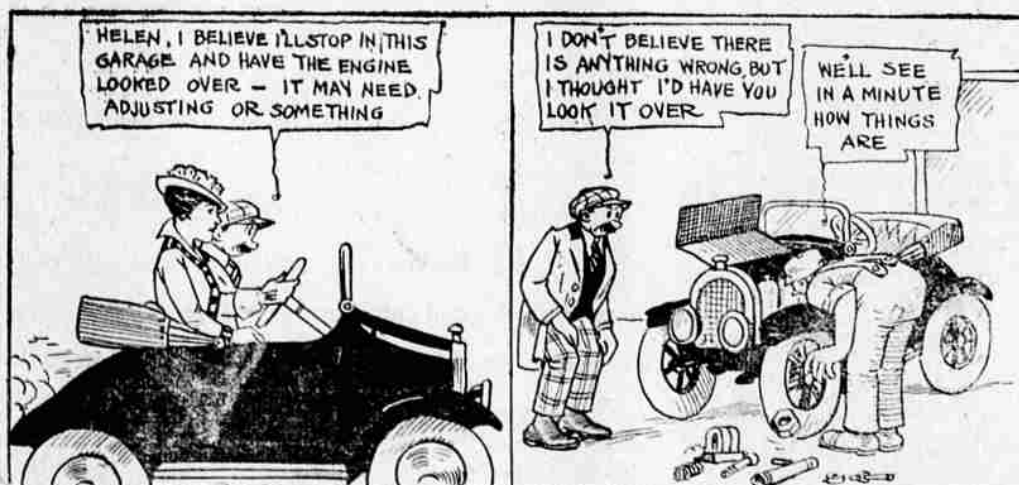
