Mr. Ostlund is going away feeling more confident than ever of the value of his Arctic City group of quartz claims on Cracker Creek north of Sumpter—not that he has ever lost faith in the value of the property during the years that he has spent developing them. The cause of this smile at this particular time is an assay made for him a few days ago at the Columbia mine. The assay was made from concentrates saved from panings and showed a total value of \$1125.65—55 oz. gold and 25 oz. of silver.

His family accompanied him to La Grande. Mr. Ostlund has been working almost continuously at the mine for the past two years, and is anxious to get back again as soon as he can.
