SWINE TAKE STIFF SPURT

SHARP ADVANCE FORCED IN PORTLAND MARKET

Mutton Quiet With No Offerings and Beef Is Steady

Sharp advance in the price of swine was forced in the North Portland yards yesterday. Sales were made at \$7.75 @ 7.85 for extreme tops, confirming the forecasts of a higher market made recently. By this advance reaches the high point in the country so far as the leading recognized livestock markets are concerned.

Mutton and lamb market conditions are naturally of good character with such a small showing of supplies; there not being sufficient stuff available to thoroughly test the situation. Cattle were steady yesterday at North Portland. Initial run for the week was small in comparison with last Monday and early trading indicated that killers were quite keen to take hold at current values.
