IMBLER NEWS

Imbler, Oregon, April 17—(Special) Our streets are being decorated with the addition of shade trees. What we need most now is a string of cement walks, one of which should lead to the new school building.

Sunday afternoon the thousands and ten thousands of trout were seen by the writer. They were all sizes ranging from babies only an inch long, to veterans of 11 ft. The only reason we failed to land any of the finny tribe was because it was the day of rest—and Hans Westenskow was taking good care of his fish farm. The Imbler trout hatchery and ponds are comparatively new, yet Mr. Westenskow, ided by one of Oregon's best springs, has built up a thriving industry. This spring which emerges from the foot of the mountain, has a capacity of between 300 and 400 gallons per minute and this ample supply of fresh water has made possible the building of 3 large ponds besides the 3 cement tanks in the shed, in which are kept the sizes and breeding stock. The Portland hotels cater to this product desiring fish about 7 inches long and a thriving trade has thus been built up. The work is handled in the same manner as the government salmon hatcheries, and although on a smaller scale, appear to be quite as successful.

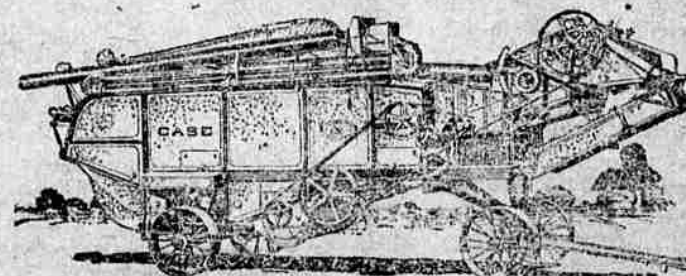
