GLEN OLIVER WILL JOIN LOCAL CLUB

Effort to Beat Baker's Record of 400 Is Being Exerted

An addition to the La Grande team's infield will be made next Sunday when Baker comes here to attempt to repeat its performance of last Sunday. Glen Oliver, crack infield and football player who has just returned from Portland will be shifted to shortstop and Galbraith will go to second. A youngster named Gordon who has been playing in the fast City league at Portland, is also trying out for an infield position and may make things warm for some of the present holders of positions on the team before the season is over. He was out yesterday to warm up.

Preparations for handling a big crowd Sunday are under way. This will be the opening game for the LaGrande team on its home grounds, having been away every Sunday thus far.

Good weather is in prospect, and a banner crowd, one that will beat the Baker attendance of 400 is looked for. The admission is held down to 25 cents for gate and grandstand too, so that the price nee deek none away.

New York, Apr. 21.—A legacy left to New York state's devotees of the arena and padded mitt the state legislature, which was preparing today to adjourn sine die promises a new

deal in managing fistic affairs.

Among the more important measures acted upon by the expiring legislature was the Malone bill, reorganizing the state boxing commission, providing for the appointment of three new commissioners and ousting of the old Democratic commission. The Malone bill gives the state tax on boxing exhibitions from 5 to 7 1-2 per cent of the gate receipts. A secretary to the commission at \$3,000 is another choice plum for some Republican fistic expert.

Mike Donovan, veteran trainer and up to a few months ago boxing instructor at the New York Athletic Club, has been an active candidate for appointment as one of the new commissioners. Donovan's application has the signature of endorsement of many financiers. He was one star middleweight boxer and is a civil war veteran. He was recently retired by the N. Y. Athletic Club.

Those in the know here do not believe that an attempt will be made by fight promoters to boost admission prices because of the proposed extra state tax. They are chiefly anxious regarding the attitude of the Commission on regulations of boxing matches and, particularly, the question of granting permits to new clubs.

Some fight promoters declare that the fight game is being over done here that too many clubs are giving exhibitions with the result that few are making any money, except when headliners are matched.
