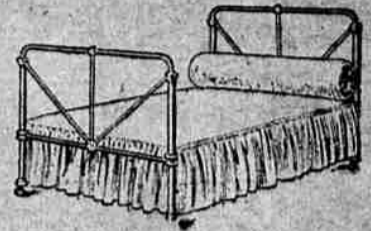

ACCIDENT ECHO HEARD.

Injury to Woman at Union in 1911 Results in Sensations.

A Portland paper recites trial developments in the case wherein a woman passenger was injured at Union in 1911, and the damage trial resulting therefrom now on in Portland:

Dr. M. J. Buck, a Pittsburg physician, admitted on the witness stand in Circuit Judge Morrow's court yesterday that he accompanied Miss Myrtle Davis, a nurse, to Portland to give expert testimony in her suit for \$165,000 against the Oregon-Washington Railroad & Navigation Company. The railroad has summoned brakemen, conductors, porters, detectives and passengers from many different states to prove that Dr. Buck traveled as the husband of Miss Davis, whom he swore yesterday was injured for life as a result of falling on the station platform at Union, Ore., in 1911.

Miss Davis formerly was employed by Dr. Buck in his Pittsburg sanitarium. When she was injured four years ago she went to him for treatment. Dr. Buck made a deposition to be submitted in the suit, but when the trial was called he appeared in person to testify.

Under cross-examination by Attorney Cochran for the railroad company, Dr. Buck admitted yesterday morning that he had traveled with Miss Davis on the trip from Pittsburg to Portland. He also admitted that he had

occupied the same room with her in a hotel at Baker, Or. He added, however, that he sat up all night and did not go to bed.

Miss Davis charges that her injuries are due to the fact that the railroad company did not have lights around its station at Union. She says she went to the station at midnight, September 17, 1911, to meet a train, and in the darkness fell down a platform incline.
