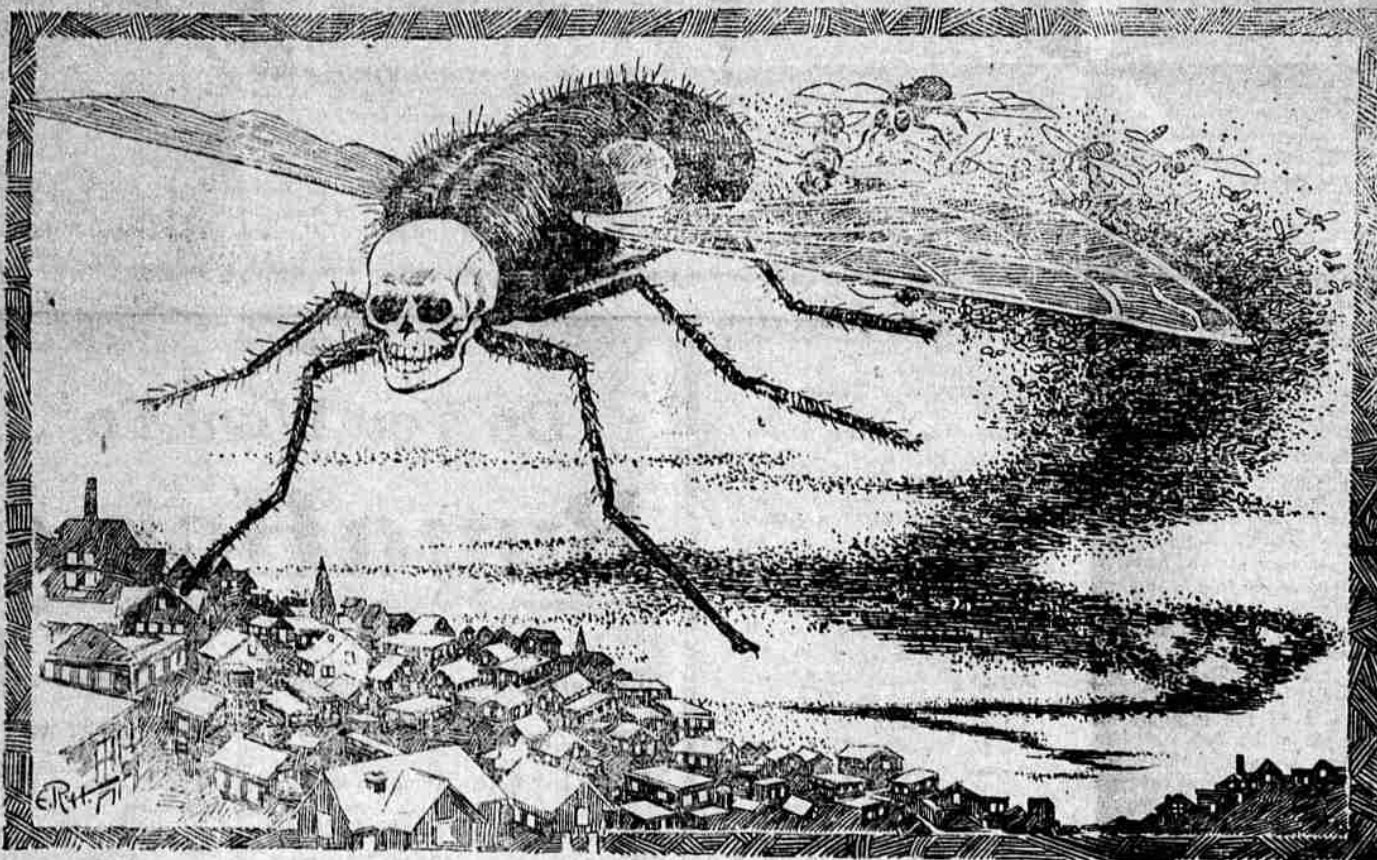

Swat the Fly Early and Often and Thus Guard Against the Disease Germs Flies Spread.

The Grande Ronde hospital has issued a few suggestions to lumber and logging camps in this section regarding things to do to prevent typhoid fever, and as this is a topic of general interest to the public the Observer reprints the suggestions in full:

Typhoid fever is a communicable infectious disease, to which persons of all ages are liable. It terminates fatally in about one case out of eight or ten. The greatest number of deaths from typhoid fever are those of persons in the prime of life, and a peculiarity of the disease is that one person having it in a mild form may impart it in a fatal form to another. Recently it has been demonstrated that persons in apparent health may become carriers and distributors of the disease. The cause of typhoid fever is a germ called typhoid bacillus, which lives and multiplies in the intestines of a person sick with typhoid. Unsanitary surroundings, such as lack of drainage, the presence of cesspools, sewer gas, garbage and decaying matter may make a person predisposed to the disease, yet may not be the direct cause.

A characteristic early symptom of typhoid fever is the constant prostration, without apparent cause; other symptoms noticeable in the early stages, are vomiting, depression and the slow onset of a fever.

There are many ways in which the germ of typhoid fever may get to the mouth of the victim. It leaves the

body of the patient in the passages from the bowel and bladder, in the bath water, the bed linen, and in the dishes used for food. It seldom is carried in the dust in the air. If the discharges of a typhoid patient are not disinfected, they are poured on the ground, they may wash into a well or a water course, and give the disease to those who drink the water thus infected. In this way many people have suffered as a result of the carelessness of people living higher up the stream from which the supply of water is taken.

Milk is often infected by the path being washed in contaminated water or from the hands of some one who has nursed a case of fever. The germ grows and multiplies in milk, and soon infects a large supply. Many epidemics of the disease have been spread in this way.

The discharges from a typhoid patient are sometimes used for manure. Any person eating vegetables, such as lettuce or celery, which are served uncooked, and which has been fertilized in this way, are apt to take the disease.

Anything that has been handled by those employed about typhoid cases is liable to give the disease, if put into the mouth.

Flies are common carriers of typhoid fever. They breed and feed in

the privy, and in the stable. They may feed one minute on typhoid discharges in the privy, and the next be lighting on the food and drink that is to be taken into the mouth, filling the food with the deadly germs of the disease and rendering it poisonous.

Typhoid fever may be taken by contact with a person having the disease, although it is not contagious like measles or scarlet fever. Every case of typhoid should be isolated and cared for as if it were a case of real contagion. Typhoid is due to a germ the germs of the disease are always in the intestinal discharge, or urine, of a typhoid patient. When a person takes typhoid fever it means that he has taken into his mouth food or drink contaminated with human excrement containing typhoid germs.

The windows and doors of all houses and especially of the kitchen and dining room, should be well screened and flies kept out. Unless this is done a careless case of typhoid in the neighborhood may be a great source of danger.

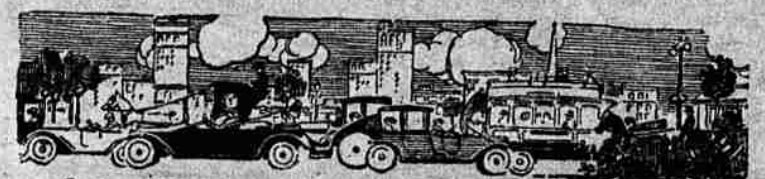
All dry closets should be dug deep and the light kept out as the flies will avoid dark places. When not in use a lid should cover the seat and the door closed and latched. The privy should be disinfected from time to time with lime in order to destroy flies if any are there. Till garbage

should be cleaned up.

If you have reason to believe that his own life as well as yours and your neighbor is carelessly risking not taking proper precautions, notify your superintendent in charge.

His neglect is not only a menace to his own family, but to all the neighborhood.

After reading the above you will see the necessity for the expression: "Swat The Fly!"

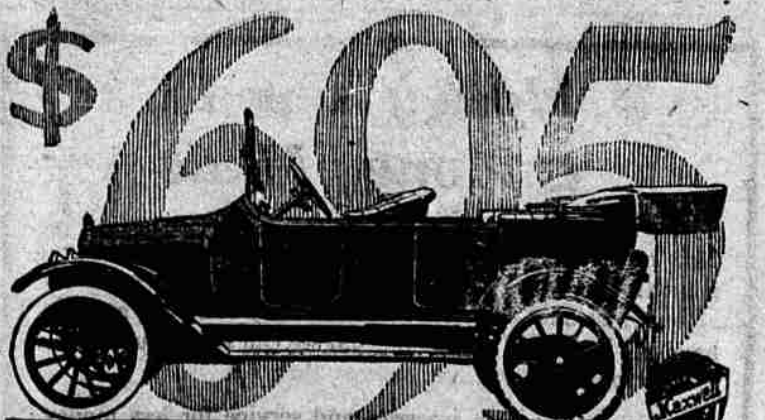
