Added to this choice morsel for week-end shoppers, grocers have provided for shipments of strawberries and tomatoes tomorrow but just what the prices will be is not known here until the stuff arrives. 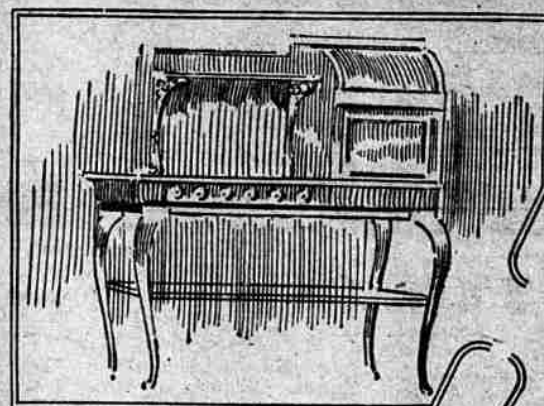
