Will Attend World's Great Bluecock
Contest in Chicago.

Rayburn broke 98 blue rocks out of 100 in the main event of the Oregon State Trapshooters' association tournament, which came to a successful close at the Portland Gun Club Tuesday afternoon.

Competition in the main event was so close that a shoot-off was necessary before the seven high men could be awarded trophies.

During the two days' shoot Frank Troeh, of Vancouver, led the amateur with a grand total of 382 out of a possible 400, while H. E. Poston, of San Francisco, showed his heels to the other professionals by his mark of 386.

Pete O'Brien was second high amateur of the main event, with his mark of 96 per cent, and Frank Van Atta was but one marker behind. James W. Seavey, of Eugene, with his first high run of 79, was awarded the handsome gold watch offered by the Portland Gun club.

L. Rayburn, who won the main event yesterday, has been shooting less than three years and his first real test was a month ago, when he won the Imperial hotel diamond medal. Rayburn replaces Henry F. Wiholm, of Gresham, in making the journey East on behalf of the Oregon State Trapshooters' association.

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Printing Point Does Not Bob Up and Down
