CLUB COUNCIL WILL CONVENE

Interest is being taken by La Grande club women in the coming conference and general convention of the council of Federated Women's Clubs of the United States in Portland early in June. The purposes of the meeting, who composes the council and various other matters of interest to La Grande people who intend to send delegates to the council, are set out in a letter from the official head of the federation to the Neighborhood club of this city. It says:

Walthill, Nebraska, April 15.—The Mid-Biennial Council of the General Federation of Women's Clubs will meet in Portland, Oregon, June 1, 2, 3, 1915. As stated in Art. V, Sec. 1 of the By-Laws the following constitute the members of the Council: "The Board of Directors, Past Presidents of the General Federation, Presidents of State Federation, President of Clubs and kindred organizations, Chairmen of Departments of Work, Chairmen of Sub-Committees and General State Secretaries." All members of the General Federation are invited to attend meetings and assist in carrying out the object of the Council which is "to consider and to promote the interests of the General Federation of Women's Clubs." It is the object of the program committee to make this a genuine Council with ample opportunity for conferences and discussions.

Details of the Program will be given in the May number of the General Federation Magazine.

On the evening of May 31st, a reception will be given for the visitors in the ball room of the Hotel Multnomah. Tuesday evening, Dr. William J. Foster, President of Reed College, will speak on the "Spirit of the Northwest."

Thursday evening, the address will be by Dr. David Starr Jordan on "Woman and the Peace Movement."

The sessions of the Council will be held in the White Temple, headquarters being in Hotel Multnomah. The credential room in parlors of the White Temple will be open for local Club Women Saturday, May 29th, 10 a. m. to 4 p. m. and for general registration Monday, May 31st, from 9 a. m. to 4 p. m., and Tuesday, June 1st, from 8:30 a. m.

"Club women will please present their visiting cards with their Portland address when registering. Special tables will be provided for the registration of visiting club women. The Committee requests all Council members and visitors to register as early after arrival in the city as possible."
