NEW COMPANY HANDLES WOOL

WALLOWA COUNTY PEOPLE BEHIND VENTURE

E. W. Rumble is General Manager of New Wool Warehouse

As a result of the initiative of Wallowa county sheepmen, the Columbia River Wool Warehouse company was organized a few days ago with headquarters in Portland, relates an Enterprise paper. Jay H. Dobbin is president and E. W. Rumble general manager of the company. The list of stockholders includes, Mr. Dobbin, Mr. Rumble, Fred W. Falconer and Robert N. Stanfield, sheep and wool growers, and many of the leading bankers of Portland.

The purpose of the company is to establish and maintain a warehouse in Portland, where proper classifications and gradings of fleeces will be effected and the wool will be offered to the buyers either in sealed bids or at auction. Warehouse room will rent at first, and a building erected later when business warrants.

While the part to be taken by the company in handling this season's clip is not altogether settled, it is probable the warehouse will be open before summer, and that it will receive considerable wool of the new clip. Many buyers from the eastern states are in the city and no doubt will be glad to attend any sales at the new warehouse.

One Horse to Five People (Farm and Fireside.)

On January 1, 1915, people were five times as numerous in the United States as horses; and horses were five times as numerous as mules. Texas had over twice as many mules (753,000) as Missouri, its closest competitor. Texas also led in cattle (5,121,000), having nearly twice as many as Iowa. Iowa had twice as many swine (8,720,000) as Illinois, its closest competitor.

Montana and Wyoming are the two greatest sheep states, each having about 4,400,000 head. New Mexico and Ohio come next, with about 3,300,000 apiece.

Rhode Island has 23,000 milch cows and Nevada 24,000. Wisconsin has the most, 1,626,000.

Sewer Still in Water.

Still working in a watery ditch, the sewer diggers are making slow progress, says the Enterprise Chief-tain. They are almost out of the Bank pasture, but have probably 500 feet more of the porous, wet soil ahead of them before they get into the more promising district. In the present stretch of the work it is necessary to crib the sides of the trench, making continuous walls of planks.

Hard gravel underlies the top layer of rich black soil, and digging this out is tedious work, particularly when a small stream of water is running along the bottom.

The sewer pipe has been distributed along the streets for several blocks beyond where the men are working, and it looks as if the town was really going to have sewers before long.
