GOATS ARE UNIQUE

Hibberd Ranch Near Imbler Utilizes Band for Clearing Purpose.

Imbler, April 30.—(Special)—A unique feature of the Hibberd ranch is a flock of goats which Mr. Morgan is utilizing to clear a large island covered with a mass of willows. The goats climb the leaning trees and may often be seen ten or twelve feet above ground nibbling the green shoots. Although living on nothing but shrubs, there is the income of the annual increase and the Spring clipping of mohair. Mr. Hibberd is proud of his stock on "Goat Island," claiming them to be his best paying animals on the ranch.

Detroit, Mich., April 30.—Midnight tonight will witness the permanent closing of more than 300 saloons and several breweries in ten Michigan counties that swung from "wet" to "dry" in the recent state election. Beginning tomorrow, forty-four counties in the state will be dry territory, while only in thirty-nine, will the saloons have legal existence.

The election placed more than half of the area of the state in "dry" territory, but nearly a million more persons will reside in the "wet" counties than in those that are dry.
