New Rural Route Out of Union

Postmaster Skiff has received notice from the Fourth Assistant Postmaster General of the establishment of Postal Route No. 2 out of Union, tri-weekly service. George McDow, carrier on Route No. 1, has been assigned also to Route No. 2, and will alternate trips. The new route covers the country—starting at the Union Postoffice and going south 8 miles, then southeast to Fisk corner 10 3/4 miles, thence northwest to postoffice 17 miles total 39 miles. The salary of the carrier has been fixed at \$1,100 per year. Postmaster Skiff has been working on this route for a long time and is naturally gratified at the success attained. The people of Union and vicinity will also be pleased. Service on the new route will begin June 16, after box and other regulations have been complied with.—Union Republican.
