"Baker will have baseball both Saturday and Sunday, when the Union team comes here for two games. The Saturday game is a postponed contest from two weeks ago, when bad weather prevented the game, and the Sunday game is the regularly scheduled Eastern Oregon league game.

"Manager Jackson announces that Rosbury will pitch the Saturday game for Baker, and he will be seen in action for the first time except in high school and Twilight league contests. He made good in the few innings he pitched at La Grande and gives promise of becoming a great twirler. Stiles will pitch for Baker Sunday.

"There will be a number of new faces in the Baker lineup, both Alton and Oral Hogoboom having been out for practice, and they will add much strength to the local infield. The Eastern Oregon league games thus far have been good ones and local fans have an opportunity of seeing two good games. The bad weather has worked a hardship on the management financially and good attendance Saturday and Sunday will help materially.

Strayer Explains Ferris Measure. Baker, May 6.—Although a quorum of directors was not present, quite a lengthy informal session was held at the Commercial club last evening. The greater part of the time was taken by Senator Strayer, who at the request of Secretary Miles explained the Ferris bill now before congress, and in opposition to which the local booster club has been asked to join.

The Ferris bill, fathered by Secretary Lane, which has been widely discussed in the west, provides for leasing of water power rights of the western states for a period of 50 years, the ultimate profits to be divided equally between the states and federal government. This in brief means that the government gets ultimately half of the profits accruing from water power sites throughout the west. It is a sort of a compromise, designed to prevent private monopoly and at the same time one that will give the western states some benefit as well as returning revenue to the federal government. Its passage means perpetually tying up the water power resources of Oregon and all other western states.

Senator Strayer's explanation made the situation very clear and the board will probably take action to join the efforts made by the commercial bodies of the northwest to defeat the bill, although it is recognized in some quarters as being the best means of settling the water power question.

Director Feitag and Prof. Voelker of the Baker Concert band asked the club's moral support if the band should attempt to stage a Fourth of July celebration, explanation being made that the band might by this means raise funds to help finance their proposed trip to San Francisco and Los Angeles. No action was taken, there not being a quorum present, but assurance was given that the proposition would be considered and action taken as soon as possible.

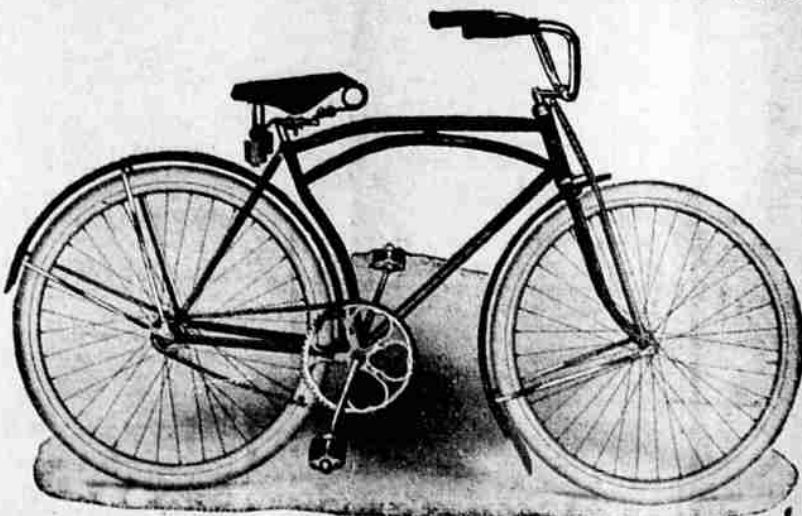
