laborers. He wanted more laborers, on the committee. President Smith grass assured him that the club had the interests of the workmen at heart. The petitioners had no regular spokesman, and only a few were inclined to discuss the matter at length. They made it clear however that they were desirous of permanent road projects at this time when employment was scarce and more results could be derived, they argued, from expenditures on roads now than at any other time.

Many of the petitioners were substantial taxpayers, several North side citizens being present. Some were unemployed and many others were men already employed in other lines of work but were desirous of seeing a campaign opened that would not only improve the roads but do it on a basis that would bring the greatest returns to the laboring classes who, in the dull period of the present commercial depression, are either working on short time or not at all.

In their appeals for concerted campaigns to alleviate the conditions existing here, as everywhere, the speakers stated that there is more or less unemployment in the Grande Ronde valley and they believed that wherever possible conditions should be arranged to better matters.

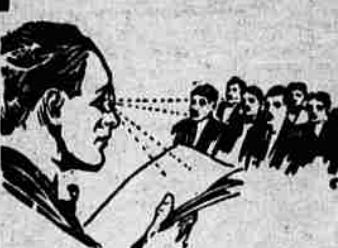

Premier Salandra in Conference with Cabinet Again.

Reported Shooting Not Fatal and Chagas is Alive.

Madrid, May 18.—Although early reports said he had been killed, Lisbon dispatches declare Premier Chagas, shot by Senator Freitas who in turn was killed by a bystander, was only wounded. The dispatch stated Chagas, who was yesterday made president of the new government, was alive with a chance for recovery, although he may lose the sight of one eye. Revolutionists continue to control Portugal.
