Division No. 54—Four-in-hand team to be shown to coach or suitable vehicle; conformation, style and manners to be considered, also appointments and driving.

Class 28—Showmen's Prize
(First prize in this class, Mantle clock, Westminster chiming, awarded by Mr. J. D. Farrell, Pres. O. W. R. & N. Co., Portland Oregon.)

Division No. 149—The prize will be given to animals exhibited in the most attractive manner. The object of such prize being to encourage the skillful fitting and training of horses for the show ring. The award will be made to the animal that shows the most finish, best grooming, best manners and that is most skillfully exhibited.

Class 29—Gentlemen's Driving Competition (Special)

Division No. 150—Gentleman's driving competition. Single driver driven to four-wheeled vehicle, making best showing, driving horse under the Judge's instructions. Prize to be awarded for manner of handling the whip, reins and general horsemanship department.

Class 30—Special Award.
Division No. 151—Award will be given for the best turnout participating in events of the show and shown on the grounds during the three days, June 2, 3, 4.

NOTE—The management would kindly ask all exhibitors to send in entries early, and also designate whether they desire single or box stalls. Box stalls can only be allotted where absolutely necessary, as they are limited.

Class 30A—Grand Champion
(First prize in this class a silver trophy awarded by the Union Live Stock Association.)

All pure bred stallions holding first prize honors eligible to compete for grand champion prize. This class is open to any horse of the draft type of any breed holding honors as above stated.

For best draft stallion and six of his get, from pure bred sire and unregistered dams, four years old and under.
(A silver trophy will be given by

Racing Programme

(Wednesday, June 2, 2:30 P. M.)
(The Association reserves the right to change any race or races.)

Appropriate cash prize will be awarded for all races.

First Event—Three-eighths mile dash, free for all, three horses to start.

Second Event—Ladies relay race. Three strings of horses must enter, four horses to the string, each horse running half a mile. No unsaddling and resaddling at the end of each half mile.

Third Event—Novelty race (walk trot and run), 3 horses to start, square walking the first quarter, trotting the second quarter, then running one-half mile.

Fifth Event—Half mile dash, free for all, three horses to start.

Sixth Event—Roman race, one-half mile, two to start.

Seventh Event—Chariot race, half mile, two entries.

Special events to be added throughout the programme.

Thursday, June 3, 2:30 P. M.

(The Association reserves the right to change any race or races.)

First Event—Five-eighths mile race free for all, three horses to start.

Second Event—Ladies relay race, continued. Three strings of horses to enter, four horses to the string, each horse running one-half mile. No unsaddling and resaddling.

Third Event—One-half mile dash at least six horses to start, equal number of horses starting under the wire in opposite directions, making finish under the wire at starting point.

Fourth Event—Gentleman's relay race, continued. Three strings of horses must enter, four horses to the string, each horse running one-half mile; unsaddling and resaddling fresh mount at the end each half mile.

Fifth Event—Three-quarter mile dash, free for all, three horses to start.

Sixth Event—Ladies race one-half mile dash, three horses to start.

Seventh Event—Roman race, half mile, two to start.

Eight Event—Chariot race, half mile, two entries.

Special events to be added throughout the programme.

Friday, June 4, 2:30 P. M.

(The Association reserves the right to change any race or races.)

First Event—Three-eighths mile dash, free for all, three horses to start.

Second Event—Ladies relay race, continued. Three strings of horses to enter, four horses to the string, each horse running one-half mile. No unsaddling and resaddling at the end of each half mile.

Third Event—Novelty race (walk, trot and run), three horses to start, square walking the first quarter, trotting the second quarter, then running the one-half mile.

Fourth Event—Gentleman's race continued. Three strings of horses must enter, four horses to the string, each horse running one-half mile; unsaddling and resaddling fresh mount at the end of each half mile.

Sixth Event—Boy's pony race, half mile dash, three to start; for boys under 16 years of age (only ponies allowed to start.)

Notice of Proposed Street Improvement.

To whom it may concern: You are hereby notified that the Committee on Estimates, appointed by the commission of the City of La Grande, Oregon, to make an examination of the property, upon which assessments are to be levied to pay the costs and expenses of the street improvement hereinafter described, as to the valuation and extent, if any of the benefits to be derived by said property by reason of said improvement, have made their report in writing to said Commission, which report has been received by said Commission, and is on file in the office of the Recorder of said city, and is open for your inspection. That it is the intention of the said Commission to levy a special assessment against all the property hereinafter described for the purpose of paying the costs and expenses of improving the alley in block 107, of Chaplin's Addition to the City of La Grande, Oregon, between Washington Avenue and Adams Avenue, said improvement extending from the southeasterly property line of Elm Street to the northwest property line of Fir Street, by grading said alley in said block 107, in said Chaplin's Addition, to the proper sub-grade and constructing thereon a concrete pavement, twenty feet in width between the property lines in said alley and constructing the proper catch basins and pipes for drainage purposes, according to the plans and specifications therefor heretofore adopted by said Commission and on file in the office of the Recorder of said city.

That the real property included in and the boundaries of the district benefited and affected by said proposed improvement are as follows: Commencing at the northeast corner of block 107 of Chaplin's Addition to the Town of La Grande, Union County, Oregon, and running thence southwesterly along the west line of Fir Street to the southeast corner of said block; thence northwesterly along the north line of Washington Avenue to the southwest corner of said block; thence northeasterly along the east line of Elm street to the northwest corner of said block and thence southeasterly along the south line of Adams Avenue to the place of beginning, all in the City of La Grande, Oregon, and the estimated cost of said proposed improvement is \$850.00.

You will further take notice that said City Commission will meet at the Commission Chamber in the City Building of said city on the 26th day of May, 1914, at 7:30 o'clock, p. m. of said day to consider making said proposed levy and will then and there grant a hearing to any and all persons feeling aggrieved against, or on account of, said proposed assessment.
