SCHOOL BOARD PICKS JUNE 21

**ELECTION OF DIRECTORS TO BE
HELD THAT DAY.**

Final Salary Budget Passed at Meeting Last Evening.

Monday June 21 was last night set as the date of the annual school election in the La Grande school district. Election of a director, reading of reports, etc., will constitute the business to come before the taxpayers on that occasion. The Board of Education met last night, all being present. The last salary budget was allowed, and 34 diplomas were authorized.

The board received and accepted the resignation of Arthur Hayes, principal of Greenwood school, who goes to Prairie City next year. While no successor was chosen the board did pick two new grade teachers, Olga Jordan and Fannie B. Straub of Chisholm, Minn.

Girls to Have a Camp at the Salem State Fair this Year.

Provisions to accommodate County Industrial club girls at the State fair this year have been made by the state department of schools. Last year La Grande sent a unique representative to the fair, and that act no doubt instilled greater interest in the girls' department. Last year Industrial club boys were cared for splendidly at the State fair—this year, girls, too, are to have their inning.

Writing of this important fact to Mrs. A. E. Ivanhoe, county superintendent of schools, J. A. Churchill, state superintendent, remarks:

"We are pleased to announce that the State Fair board has authorized a school camp for the girls at the State Fair this year. The conditions are practically the same as for the boys' camp. The girls from each county winning the highest number of points in any club project will be entitled to membership in the camp, provided their transportation to and from the fair is arranged for by the county or otherwise. This department will appoint the matron and be responsible for the proper management of the camp, and no pains will be spared to make it what it should be in every particular. We hope to have two girls from your county, as well as two boys, and a collective county exhibit."
