Earl Stoddard, a Baker lumberman is in town today to attend the M. I. A. Field Day. He is stopping at the Sommer hotel.

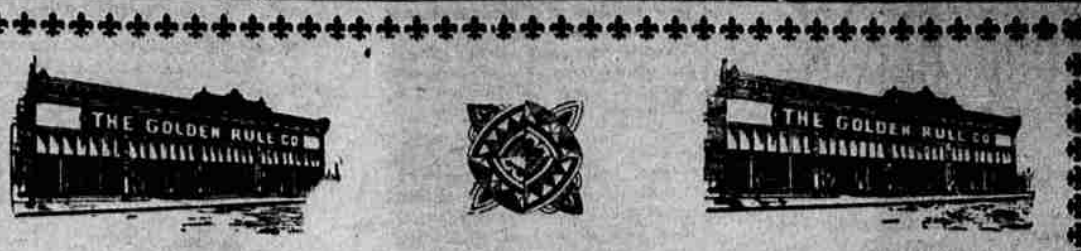
Miss Bessie Gilkinson, of North Powder, returned today after a visit with her uncle and aunt Mr. and Mrs. Frank Jackson.
