Ranch eggs have raised five cents in price since Friday. Strawberries are now selling at two boxes for a quarter regularly while Millions are bringing 10 cents and 3 boxes for a quarter.
Ranch eggs have raised five cents since Friday. Spinach is out of the market entirely. Strawberries are

Fish Trap Hill Road, Improved.

The many people who have had occasion to travel the road leading from Elgin to the Flat speak in the highest terms of the improvement made to that thoroughfare, especially at point on Fish Trap hill, where extensive grading and smoothing has been completed under the direction of Supervisor Link Wood, says the Elgin Recorder. All are of one accord in saying it is the best single improvement that has been made to the road in recent years.

It is noticeable and appreciable that interest is growing rapidly in the good roads movement in the Elgin section and despite continued rains, the roads are still in good condition. A natural tendency on the part of all for better roads is having a great effect, and to this the rapidly increasing number of automobiles has added great impetus.

Providing New Road Drags. Six new road drags have been received in Elgin from the county to be used in dragging the roads in the various districts of this section, relates the Elgin Recorder. The county court is furnishing drags free to those who made application and will agree to use them, and that good results will follow from this action there is no question. There are already several drags in this section

and the benefits derived have encouraged others to use them.

One of the new drags now on hand has been allotted to Wm. Roulet and another will be used by W. B. Hindman.

There are certain sections of the Indian creek road where these drags are needed, and if those residing in that neighborhood desire to improve that thoroughfare they can obtain the necessary drags by applying to County Commissioner Galloway, of this city.

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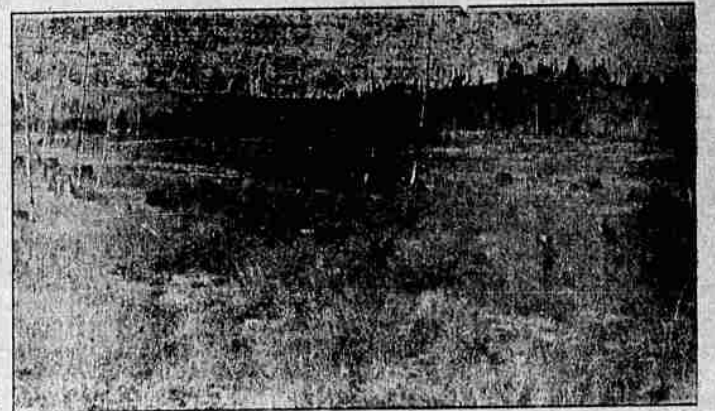
