SLOW MOVEMENT TOWARD PORTLAND SUNDAY.

General Range of Prices Over Week Ago Is Downward. Portland, May 31.—It was a waiting market all through the livestock trade at North Portland for the day. The week opened with the ideas of buyers and sellers apart. This was especially true of the swine division where buyers generally were offering \$7.75 @ 7.85 for tops, while commission interests were holding out for \$8 straight. run of swine in the yards over Sunday, totals were fractionally less than last week. There was only a fair movement of mutton and lambs to the North Portland yards over Sunday. General trade conditions are showing little, if any, change. Two loads came from the Willamette valley and two from the Columbia river section.

Human Skeleton Is Unearthed.

Baker, May 31.—The finding of a skeleton on the Walter Palmer ranch on Lower Powder was reported to Coroner West yesterday. The bones were revealed when a portion of an irrigation ditch bank caved in. There was no evidence of any casket, and some believe that the bones are either those of an Indian or some pioneer, who died near that spot and was hastily buried. The condition of the skeleton indicated that it had been in the ground upwards of 20 years.
