Charles Russell is High Man. Pendleton, June 5.—Charles Russell, one of this year's graduates from the agricultural course at the Pendleton high school, had the distinction of making the highest individual score in the stock judging contest at the Union Stock show yesterday. In the contest composed of pupils from the Union and Pendleton high schools, Russell made 268 points out of a possible 300. In the contest it was necessary for the students to give all their reasons for their work and young Russell won high praise from the judges for

the ability displayed. His work is also regarded as complimentary to the Pendleton school and instructor Gambee, since all his agricultural training was received here. Russell is the son of John Russell of this city and has been prominent in the high school both for his scholastic work and as an athlete. The Pendleton stock judging team was composed of Charles Russell, Fred Russell, Norman Stearns, Russell Wilbur and Enoch Friedly. In the team contest the Pendleton boys made a combined score of 1107 against 1177 by the Union team. The showing of the Pendleton boys is exceptionally good considering the circumstances of the contest. The Union students were familiar with the stock judges and had been preparing for the contest for over a month, whereas the Pendleton boys were wholly unacquainted with the stock and did not know they would take part in the contest until a few days ago.
