Italy Will Be a Big Horse Purchaser.

Lincoln, Neb., June 5.—Information received by Nebraska horse-buyers indicate that Italy will be a heavy purchaser of horses throughout the middle western states in the near future. Orders are said already to have

been received for tested and inspected animals for such consignment. The recent reported order of 80,000 mules to be purchased throughout this section and assembled in Nebraska for assignment to European ports, is apparently being filed, as shipments are being made just as soon as several carloads are on hand.

UMATILLAN ON RAMPAGE

AGED WOMAN SLAUGHTER AND MAN SHOT.

Drunken Resident of Pilot Rock Section Starts Tragedy.

Pendleton, June 5.—The East Oregonian said last night: Mrs. Charles Ogilvie, living in California Gulch, seven miles south of Pilot Rock, was murdered last evening by Lee Dale, a homesteader living near by and when Mr. Ogilvie, aged husband of the murdered woman rushed to her aid Dale placed the muzzle of the gun against the old man's stomach and fired. Mr. Ogilvie will probably die.

At the time of the murder Dale was on an "alcohol" drunk and when arrested this afternoon by Sheriff Taylor was still in a drunken condition. He was arrested by the sheriff who found him lying in bed with a loaded 33-30 rifle by his side. The sheriff grabbed the rifle and then placed Dale under arrest.

The full circumstances of the murder and probably double murder made a very brutal tale of horror. Dale arrived horseback at the Ogilvie place about 7 o'clock last evening according to Mr. Ogilvie who was rational this morning and made a complete statement. When Dale arrived Mrs. Ogilvie was sitting on the porch and Mr. Ogilvie was in the milk house 20 feet away, Dale began quarreling with Mrs. Ogilvie and cursed her. According to the old man's story the two "jowered" and Mrs. Ogilvie told Dale to go home to his wife. He then drew his revolver and shot her, the bullet striking just below the left arm and evidently striking the heart.

Rushing out to assist his wife, Mr. Ogilvie caught her just as she fell. After being himself shot, Mr. Ogilvie made his way into the house and fell unconscious on the floor. Later he became conscious and thinking he would die wrote a statement of the crime on a calendar. This morning he corroborated his written statement in talking with a dozen or more people gathered from Pilot Rock. He then became unconscious and was taken to Pilot Rock where he is being operated upon this afternoon.

Slept Near Corpse

Discovery of the ghastly crime was made this morning by James Stubblefield, a young hired man on the Ogilvie place. Last evening Stubblefield went to his home place to spend the evening and did not return to the Ogilvie place until midnight when he went to sleep in a tent, wholly ignorant of the murder and of the fact his employer was then lying at death's door inside the house.

Arising this morning Stubblefield wondered why the old folks were not in evidence. Going to the house he was horrified to see the body of Mrs. Ogilvie on the porch. Without stopping to learn anything more he hastened to the Knotts place at the mouth of California Gulch and gave the alarm.

At the time of the murder Miss Elsie Ogilvie, daughter of the couple, was living in her homestead cabin and enroute to the Knotts place Stubblefield told her of the affair.

Surrounded House
After learning the details of the crime and the identity of the slayer the people of the neighborhood formed a posse under Marshal Pickett of Pilot Rock and Constable Newcombe. They learned that Dale was inside and surrounded the house and waited for the arrival of Sheriff Taylor.

Mrs. Dale said her husband arrived home last evening and had left his horse, saddled. She unsaddled the horse and fed the animal and her husband went to bed. He said nothing what ever of the crime and Mrs. Dale was ignorant of it until informed of the facts today. She said her husband awoke several times during the night and asked for a drink but said nothing else. He has been in the habit of coming home drunk and is said to have abused his wife.

Those who know Dale say he is a good citizen when sober and is the last man they would suspect of such a murder. Mrs. Dale is a very fine woman and much sympathy is expressed for her. She remained at her home.

The Dales have no children. They have lived on their homestead for four or five years. The man is 31 or 32 years of age.

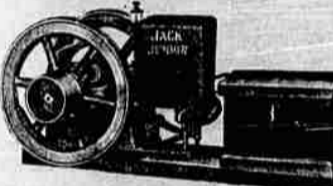
