PROMULGATE SPECIAL RULES.

(Continued from Page 1.)

of Oregon for more than fifty-four (54) hours a week under the following conditions and rules which the aforesaid Commission hereby today determines and prescribes:

1. Such emergency overtime shall not be permitted for more than six (6) calendar weeks, from May 1 to December 1 in any year.

2. The emergency overtime shall not exceed the fifty-four (54) hours a week now prescribed by I. W. C. Orders No. 2 and No. 5 by more than six (6) hours for any calendar week.

3. Nothing in this permit or order shall be interpreted as authorizing the employment of any woman for more than ten (10) hours in any day.

4. Such emergency overtime shall be paid for at a rate of not less than twenty-five (25c) an hour; and the earnings for emergency overtime shall in no case be included in the weekly minimum wage prescribed by the rulings of the Commission, but shall in every case be over and above the weekly minimum wage prescribed by I. W. C. Orders No. 2 and No. 5 for adult women workers.

5. The owner or manager of every fruit and vegetable cannery or packing establishment in Oregon employing women under this emergency overtime permit shall furnish the Industrial Welfare Commission, on or before the fifth day of each month,

6. Said transcript shall be verified by said owner or manager or some person in his behalf having knowledge of the facts by subscribing and swearing to a statement that said transcript is a full, true and accurate statement of the overtime worked by, and wages paid to each and every woman who has worked overtime.

House of Commons today by Sea Lord Balfour. Six officers and a crew of 21 were rescued and made prisoners. Nine German submarines are officially reported sunk since the beginning of the war.

The British steamer, Lady Salisbury was torpedoed and sunk by a German submarine. She sank within five minutes.

Petrograd, June 9.—Russian submarines sank a German steamer, the Hindenberg, and attacked 10 German ships in the Baltic a semi-official statement declares. A second-class German cruiser struck a mine in the Gulf of Riga and was badly damaged. Oother German vessels towed the cruiser away.
