

# INSANITY PLEA MADE BY DALE

### PENDLETON MAN'S DEFENSE IS SET UP.

#### Drug Claims Presented as Counter Charge from Accused Man.

Pendleton, June 10.—A plea of temporary insanity will be interposed to save Lee Dale, accused as the murderer of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Ogilvey of California Gulch, from conviction if he is brought to trial. That this line of defense will be offered was learned by the Tribune yesterday from Attorney Butler of Milton, who will be of counsel for the defense.

The Grand Jury, reconvened yesterday in special session, will examine a number of Pilot Rock residents in its investigation of the double murder tomorrow. The body likely will present its indictments on Friday. It is possible that a report will be made to Judge Phelps tomorrow on the Grand Jury's findings in other criminal cases which have been under investigation yesterday and today.

Speaking of the murder case yesterday, Attorney Butler, who has long been acquainted with Dale, declared that his client has no recollection of the crime attributed to him and that his mind is a blank concerning any trouble at the Ogilvey farm on the night of the tragedy.

Dale claims to have been drugged in Pendleton some time before the crime was committed, when a young woman named Margaret, at a local lodging house, induced him to loan her all of the money he had on the pretext that she needed it as a bail surety and would return it to him the following day. The money was not returned and Dale was unable to recover it although he tried.

This incident likely will play a prominent part in the trial, used by both the state and defense. The state may attempt to show that Dale was actuated to commit the crime from a motive of robbery; the defense may attempt to show that, under the effects of the drug alleged to have been administered to him, he was wholly irresponsible and that his contention of having no recollection of the crime

# LAWMAKERS COMING WEST

### APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE TO COME.

#### Irrigation Projects to Be Inspected at Close Range.

Pendleton, June 10.—Umatilla county will be host to Chairman John J. Fitzgerald and members of the Appropriations Committee of the House of Representatives of the United States on Wednesday, June 23, on the flying tour of inspection which the money committee of the House is making of the different irrigation projects of the West.

The committee plans to inspect all the going projects under construction between the time the special train leaves Dearborn Station Chicago, at 9:30 o'clock Tuesday June 1 and the time of returning 9:10 p. m., July 15. Every moment of the trip has been figured out according to the schedule which has just been distributed to members of the committee.

According to this schedule the private cars will arrive at Hermiston at 6 a. m., June 23 and leave Echo en route East at 4 p. m., the same day. There will be a ten minute stop at Pendleton at 5 o'clock, as the committee is due at Caldwell, Idaho, at 3:41 a. m., the next morning.

Representative N. J. Sinnott of the Second Oregon hopes to be with the committee during the inspection of the Hermiston and Klamath projects. He tried to get the committee to linger longer in Oregon so as to inspect different places in Eastern Oregon which are petitioning for reclamation projects, but on account of the hurried nature of the trip the committee will inspect nothing but projects already under way or completed.

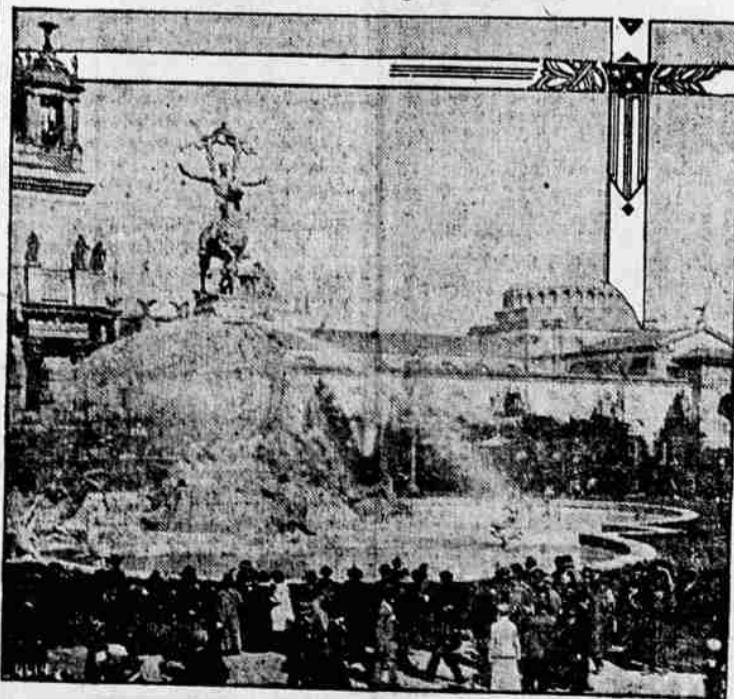
