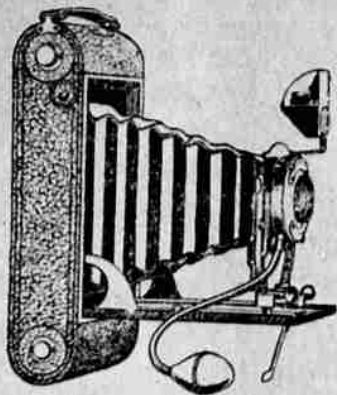

Minnesota's Settlers Land

Benidji, Minn., June 11.—In 1917 there will not be a single acre of Northern Minnesota land available to the settler, state land officers said here today. There are now over 1,000,000 acres of this land available. At a recent delinquent tax sale, there was a demand for at least 40,000 acres although there were only 275 claims available. Drainage and boosting by the state department of immigration are believed to be the causes for the heavy demand.
