CONDITIONS RESEMBLE OLD TIMES CLOSELY.

Much Meat Comes Forward for Distribution Sunday. Portland Stockyards, June 14.—It looks like old times in the yards today. Over Sunday 80 loads of livestock were unloaded. Supplies were heavier than last Monday with the exception of hogs and a small decrease was shown in that line.

General market for swine was steady to firm with early sales as high as \$7.00. Severe depression was shown for cattle at North Portland today with a much heavier run than had been generally expected.

General mutton market situation was somewhat easier in the local yards for the day with early prices about a quarter off.

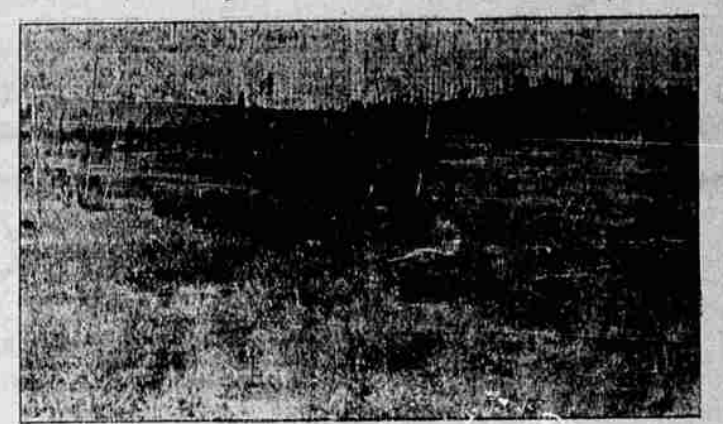
