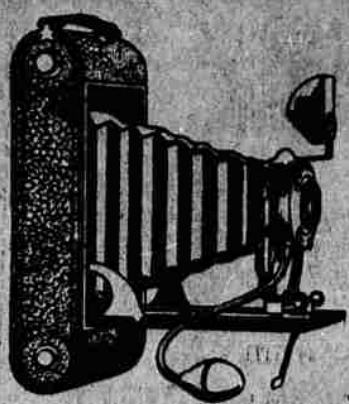




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GRAND JURORS TO MEET AGAIN

Six True Bills Returned Into Court by the Grand Jury.

For the present there is nothing more for the grand jury today to do, and the institution has recessed for a time. The final report of the grand jury, filed with the clerk of the court, reads:

Grand Jury Report for June, 1915, Term.

To the Hon. J. W. Knowles.—We, the undersigned grand jury for the June, 1915, term, of circuit court offer the following report of our doings for our first session of this term:

We have been in session five days, examined all witnesses brought before us, visited the various

places and the county poor farm, and returned into court six true bills of indictment and no bill of not true indictment.

We respectfully recommend that proper equipment and convenience for the purpose of cleaning floors and washing bedding be supplied in the county jail, and that after same is supplied, that the jailer use every endeavor to maintain the jail in as clean and sanitary condition as events will warrant.

We have investigated some matters about which there is not sufficient information before the grand jury to finally dispose of at this session. These will be disposed of later in the term.

We wish to thank the circuit judge, district attorney, bailiff and various other officials for courteous attention and assistance.

We respectfully request to be allowed to stand in recess until order of the court.
