#### FRIENDS WANT COURTESY

Quakers Deplore Partial Loss of One-Time Usual Customs.

Philadelphia, Dec. 1.—The old Quaker courtesy was the subject discussed at the first Winter meeting of the Friends' Educational Association recently at the Friends' Select School, Sixteenth and Race streets.

The first speaker was George M. Warner, who felt real courtesy lay far below the surface; and, while he saw a lack in the present generation, he felt it may be the result of stirring times, when in the light of apparently more important things courtesy is ignored.

"The highest examples," he said, "are sometimes found in the humblest walks of life. Self-esteem unduly present often fails to win where courtesy would succeed. Sound courtesy is found in the second great commandment, to love one's neighbor as oneself, for courtesy that springs from love to our fellowman is the only thing that can make an effective appeal to those who differ from us."

"The Opportunity of the School" was discussed by Anna B. Gidley, who spoke of the teachers' opportunity to teach more consideration for others and to show by example what true courtesy means. The opportunities afforded by boarding-school life carry their influence into after life.

Sarah W. Elinkton, of Moylan, dealt with "The Opportunity of the Home."

#### LIFE IS GIVEN FOR DRINK.

Son Smashes Gas Meter and Dies and Father Is Overcome.

Philadelphia, Dec. 1.—Fumes set free when Robert Heskeps, 30 years old, of No. 1441 Mutter street, smashed a slot gas meter to obtain money to satisfy his craving for drink, caused his own death and nearly ended his father's life as well. The elder Heskeps was overcome when he found his son's corpse.

An investigation by the police of the Eighteenth District revealed that young Heskeps had been drinking

heavily for several days. When his money gave out, the police say, he tried to steal it from his father, but could not force open a trunk. Then he attacked the gas meter with an ax.

He hacked at the mechanism until nothing but a distorted piece of metal remained. He paid no attention to the gas which gushed from the supply pipe and he was overcome when he attempted to climb the stairs. Later his father, John Heskeps, 66 years old, returning from a lodge meeting at mid-

night, smelled the gas as he entered the house. He descended to the cellar, where he stumbled over the body of his son. The gas was also noticed by Nicholas Bernhardt, living in a rear street, and Patrolman Whitely, of the Eighteenth District, who arrived simultaneously to investigate. They made their way with difficulty through the heavy gas fumes and dragged father and son from the cellar.

The police say that Heskeps' wife committed suicide two years ago.
