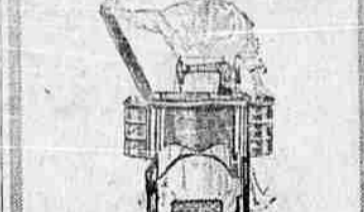

The picture he draws of the grocery bills is heart breaking; but suppose you did not order the groceries, and the grocer left them against your wishes, and although you tried hard to keep him from so doing, forced you to use them because you had no choice. What about it?

I fought the Fourth street paving project to the best of my ability. It does not increase the value of my property. I only use it from necessity, the sidewalks being spoiled because of it, therefore it is used by all South La Grande people as a sidewalk.

You, Mr. "Taxpayer," helped elect the council that put this unscrupulous affair through. Should I be the main one to pay in full for their mistakes. Is that justice? North Second street is I believe about the same proposition. Why should I not pay my share for the mistake of a council I helped elect? However as I understand it the expense of Fourth street, if we win, will fall on the Warren Construction Company, and if the proposed charter goes through and the city voluntarily saddles itself with this burden, do you suppose we will not carry it through the courts again and if we win, you Mr. "Taxpayer" will have to pay the ten dollars per thousand to which you refer and also your proportion of the court costs. Would you like that?

There are prospects that the Klammath Falls mills will run all winter. Hermiston is working for a new library.  
A movement is on foot at Scio to improve the streets.
