D. 1915, which was proposed by initiative petition signed by the requisite number of legal voters, and submitting the same to the electors of said City for their adoption or rejection, at the regular election to be held therein on December 13th A. D. 1915.

NEWS OF TWENTY-FOUR YEARS AGO

The state of Oregon through its attorney general, George E. Chamberlain has just brought suit against Baker county to recover state taxes. These taxes are due to the amount of \$11,288.96.

By the official census reports we learn that Oregon has 313,767 inhabitants. La Grande has 2523; Pendleton, 2500; The Dalles precincts 4207, and Portland, East Portland and Albina, 62,046.

David L. Heidenreich is putting up a brick veneered residence in Cogan's addition.

The school for the education of the Chinese has been re-opened and has an attendance of about twenty. There are three evening sessions each week.

There are now sixteen inmates in the county jail at Union. The next regular term of circuit court will be in May, but it is probable that a special session will be held before that time.

An ordinance authorizing the recorder to enter into a contract with Engineers Adams & Gammitt to superintend the construction of water works was passed to the second reading.
