FIRMNESS SHOWN IN SALES
MADE

Hogs Rather Steady But Inclination
Is Downward.

Portland, Dec. 13.—Cattle showed a strong trend at North Portland during the day with sales of top steers again at the \$7 mark. Several carload lots were sold at the extreme figure with killers somewhat more interested in the general situation than formerly.

There was an extremely good tone in the cow market with a carload sold early in the day at \$5.00 for favorable quality.

Market for hogs was steady at North Portland for the first day of the week. The run over Sunday totaled greater than during last Monday although the showing was slightly less than the previous week's start.
