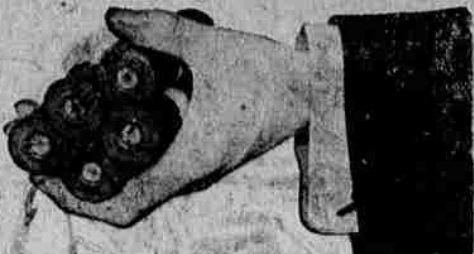

Pendleton Cafes Losers.

Pendleton, Dec. 28.—Owing to the fact that the city ordinance requires that serving of liquor stop at 11 o'clock on week-nights, thus putting Pendleton in the dry column an hour before the prohibition law goes into effect, some of the cafes and eating houses where merriment generally holds forth on New Year's eve will not make an attempt to cater to celebrators.

The dining room of the Hotel Pendleton, where all tables were reserved for New Year's eve a year ago, will not be open during Friday evening after the regular dinner hour. The all-night eating houses will of course remain open but they will not be permitted to sell liquor after 11 o'clock and according to the construction placed upon the law by the district attorney, may not serve liquor after that hour, although it might have been purchased before.

Guardian Case Decided.

Salem, Dec. 28.—The supreme court today affirmed Judge Anderson of Baker county sitting for Judge Knowles, in the matter of guardianship of David Troy, an incompetent person, of Elgin, involving a final account. The total sum of money involved is between \$3,000 and \$4,000. The litigation began prior to Mr. Troy's death, when he became a paralytic. Effort was made to sell the real estate which brought matters to a focus, and during the preliminary litigation Mr. Troy died. The late R. C. Mays of Elgin was the guardian in the estate and F. S. Ivanhoe was his attorney.

The case was appealed from County Judge Henry to the circuit court, where Judge Anderson tried it before a jury. The objectors were not satisfied with the verdict in the trial court, and appealed.

SETTLEMENT IS NEAR.

Ancona Note Will Be Final and Satisfactory It Seems.

Berlin, Dec. 28.—The entire submarine question will probably be cleared in a few days, the United Press is authoritatively informed. The Austrian reply to the Ancona rejoinder will be delivered to Ambassador Penfield at Vienna, this week. It is reported to be "Satisfactory and final."

PIONEER LADY DIED SUNDAY

Baker, Dec. 28.—At the home of her son, Arthur V. Swift, 12 miles northeast of this city, Sunday morning occurred the sudden death of Mrs. Anna B. Swift, widow of the late J. M. Swift, a pioneer of Baker county, who died 13 years ago. Acute dilation of the heart was given as the cause of Mrs. Swift's death, the attack coming almost without warning.

Mrs. Swift, had she lived, would have been 79 years of age on the 20th of next month. She was born in England and came to this county in 1872, her marriage to Mr. Swift taking place in 1873.

After her marriage to Mr. Swift, deceased lived for many years with her family on the Swift ranch, three miles north of the city, where her son, L. L. Swift now resides. She also had a home in this city. Arthur V. Swift, at whose home she passed away, is vice president of the National Farmers' Co-operative and Educational Union, and L. L. Swift is one of the best known ranchers of the valley. Besides these two sons and brother, C. B. Fisher, one daughter, Mrs. Dow Shepardson of this city, survives.

Funeral services will be held tomorrow at 2 o'clock at the Episcopal church, Rev. Owen F. Jones officiating.
