### Alleged Girl Blackmailer of Banker.

Chicago, Jan. 3.—Miss Jessie Elizabeth Cope of Los Angeles, Cal., the girl who figured in the sensational arrest and indictment of Charles Alexander, Providence, R. I., millionaire banker and steel magnate, on a white slave charge, was to be placed on trial in federal court here today on charge of attempting to bribe federal officials. The indictment against Alexander charges him with transporting Miss Cope from Los Angeles to Chicago and New Orleans, La. It is still pending.
