PORTLAND MARKETS SHOW STRONG MOVEMENT.
 Big Jump Recorded in All Lines of Retail Beef.

STORAGE EGGS DROP

A cut of five cents per dozen has been made in storage eggs, the retail price dropping from 35 to 30 cents yesterday afternoon.

Portland, Jan. 10.—Going up! These two words tell the story of the livestock market at the Portland Union Stock Yards today. Up to noon a tremendous amount of stock has been moved, with prices generally higher all along the line. Steers had not advanced, but as there were nine loads of pulp fed stuff from Utah on hand, it was expected there would be an increase to at least \$8, and possibly more, although this was not certain.
