Science, be it known, has decreed that the dimple, sweetest and most alluring of all beauty marks, is a common, ordinary defect in the anatomy.

That which in the past has been desired by beauties the country over; that for which actresses and society leaders have been operated upon that they might be called "dimpled," and that because of which men have been known to go "love mad," is now decreed a physical defect.

Dr. Martin Frederick, of the city medical staff of Cleveland, O., is the surgeon whose scientific research resulted in spreading sorrow among the country's dimpled beauties.

"Mildway's dimples," Dr. Frederick has announced, "are defects caused by faulty construction or weakness of the cheek muscles."
