# COMMISSION IN SESSION

ARRANGEMENTS MADE TO CARE FOR ACCOUNTS.

Interests and Tax Collections Dates Made to Jibe Better.

Matters to come before the city commission last evening were chiefly routine. The commissioners took an official step pertaining to re-arrangements of water funds and interest funds which makes the order of paying interest fit the dates of collecting interest taxes more equitably than under the old plan whereby the water fund carried the difference in dates until taxes came in. It was a perfunctory change that needed attention and had to be done some time.

The commissioners also heard the first and second reading of the bonding ordinance on First street sidewalks. The last warrant for building the M avenue sidewalk in 1914 was ordered paid. This cleans up that batch of work.

Reports of officers, payments of accounts and other various matters that came up in early-month meetings, were gone over.

General Manager's report for the week ending January, 8th 1916.

The Water Superintendent spent \$29.00 on repair work.

The Street Superintendent spent \$43.95 for teams and drivers and \$15.00 for White wing. He kept walks and gutters open and looked after creeks and ditches. Meal tickets cost \$16.80.

The police arrested one drunk on a city charge and four people on state charges. One was insane. Collected \$10.00 fine and \$1.00 for meals to state charges. Had 18 sleepers.

Owing to the extremely cold winter weather we had no trouble. Sleepers were pretty numerous. The police have more than the usual number of jars to smooth out. Neglected children usually show up in these cases. It takes the form of a bad example and bad environment rather than lack of food and clothing. Shocking immoral conditions are disclosed. Quite a number have recently been committed to the boys and girls aid and also to the reform school.

The Recorder collected \$10.00 fines; \$1.00 for meals for state charges; \$8.67 principal and \$3.33 interest on District No. 82. He issued five dray
