offside when he is closer to the opponent's goal than his teammate who has the puck.

Fouls Kicking the puck, tripping, body checking into the fence, catching the puck in the hand or carrying same, deliberately hitting an opponent with the stick, cross-checking, all constitute fouls and the player who is responsible is liable to a penalty of three minutes or the rest of the game, as the referee sees fit. When a player is penalized from each team at the same time for a period longer than 10 minutes, the referee has the power to allow each team to substitute another player.

The goal tender has the right to throw the puck with his hands in any direction, and can pass it forward to one of his own players, providing it doesn't go beyond the first line and into the center ice, which is the middle space marked by blue lines dividing the field of play into three divisions. In case a player of his own team takes the pass while on center ice, it is an offside play.

Golfers May Deal With Amateurs.

Chicago, Jan. 14.—Whether amateur golf stars really are amateurs when they permit their names to be used on golf balls and sticks and receive money from newspapers for what they write will be the question before the United States Golf association, which is to convene at Hotel La Salle today. A faction in the organization demands ouster proceedings against such players who call themselves amateurs. The association will award the three amateur titles, the open championship, the national amateur championship and the woman's championship, and will select cities for the 1916 meets. Frank L. Woodward, Denver, was expected to be re-elected President and H. F. Whitney, Howard L. Perrin, and John Reed all of New York, were expected to succeed themselves as secretary and first and second vice-presidents, respectively. Fred S. Wheeler of New York was slated to succeed Percy R. Pyne of Philadelphia as treasurer.

Grays Harbor Recruits Sought

Hoquiam, Wash., Jan. 12.—(Special)—Word has been received in Hoquiam that a Navy recruiting office is to be established on Grays Harbor, with Lieutenant J. H. Blackburn, United States Navy, in charge. Lieutenant Blackburn is in command of the United States Naval reserve district at Portland, and in charge of the Navy recruiting offices at Spokane, Portland and Eugene. This will be the first time that a Navy recruiting station has been located on Grays Harbor.

THE WAR BALANCE

One of the most trustworthy estimates of the cost of the war in men and money, up to the end of 1915, gives these grand totals:

Number of men killed, wounded or captured in all the armies, 8,602,000.
 Cost of the war in current expenses to all the belligerents, \$24,880,000,000.
 Thus the number of men put out of business is greater than the total population of Canada or New England or all the Rocky Mountain and Pacific Coast states together.

The money expenditure is as great as the total estimated of Austria-Hungary, greater than that of Italy and as great as that of Belgium, Spain, Holland, Switzerland and Portugal together.

The known dead amount to 1,720,000. To these should be added perhaps hundreds of thousands registered as "missing". Imagine instead of the great Iroquois theater disaster, the entire population of Chicago wiped out by some great catastrophe!

The daily cost of the war has averaged \$88,000,000. It's more than that now but that's quite enough. It's about six times as much as all the salaries and wages paid by all the manufacturing industries in the United States.

We can't grasp it of course. But we can grasp the fact that human life and energy and accumulated wealth are being destroyed in such quantities that it will take decades and perhaps generations to replace them. And in contrast with the exhaustion that Europe is incurring, we can appreciate our own blessings better.

Here are a few of the principal rules which come up frequently in hockey contests:

Each game of hockey shall consist of three periods of 20 minutes each, with a rest of 10 minutes between periods.

In the event of the score being a tie at the end of the last period, the teams will rest for five minutes and again play 20 minutes or until a goal is scored by either team. The first team scoring during an overtime period wins the game.

The hockey field is 210 feet long, and is divided into three parts, each 70 feet long by the full width of the rink. The 70 feet in the center is free ice, and there cannot be any offside in that space.

An offside play occurs when a player has the puck and passes it ahead to one of his teammates. He can carry it through himself or pass it straight across or back to a teammate, but must not pass it ahead. A player is
