Convention Will Draw.
La Grande people are greatly interested in the big layman's convention in Portland, February 13 to 16 inclusive.

The Laymen's Missionary Convention of Oregon is one of the most interesting gatherings that has ever been scheduled in the state. It will meet at Portland, February 13th to 16th, inclusive. It is a factor in a nation-wide religious movement that will reach from 75 to 80 of the leading centers of the United States.

The Convention is open to the male members of all evangelical churches of the state, and all such are earnestly urged to register their names as soon as possible. The movement is financed by prominent Portland men,

so that delegates will not be asked to contribute any money, by way of subscription or through collections, though a nominal registration of \$1.00 will be required.

Already the registrations received have broken the record make six years ago, evincing the great public interest.

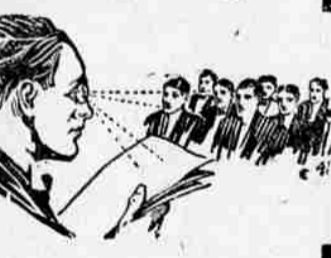
