IRRIGATION TO BE DISCUSSED

The state wide conference on irrigation, drainage and rural credits authorized by the last session of the Oregon Irrigation congress will be held in Portland during February. Call will soon be issued naming the date.

In dignity and representation the conference will approach in importance a constitutional convention. Delegates who have been or will be named are asked to draft legislation providing a limited state guaranty of principal and interest of irrigation and drainage district bonds. In reality their duty is to submit a solution of these great Oregon problems. They begin with the proposition that the reclamation of semi-arid and wet lands is essential to state development and a responsibility that the state must meet. The measures will be intended to put the state solidly and permanently back of its own reclamation. The legislation proposed will be the product of the best citizenship and the largest experience possessed by Oregon.

Resolved, that the Oregon Irrigation Congress, at its fifth annual session, urges the adoption by the State of Oregon of a constitutional amendment and legislation necessary to institute.

First: The guaranty by the State of Oregon of the interest and principal of bonds issued by irrigation and drainage districts, under proper safeguards which will insure the success of the projects placed under this guaranty.

Second: A system of state rural credits.

Be it further resolved, in order to secure the draft of the necessary constitutional amendment and legislation to accomplish these ends, that a committee of five, consisting of the incoming President and the incoming Secretary of the Oregon Irrigation Congress and three members to be appointed by the incoming President, shall be authorized and instructed as follows:

First: To call a conference to be

known as the State Irrigation Drainage and Rural Credits Conference, for the purpose of drafting the necessary constitutional amendment and legislation aforesaid.

Second: To invite delegations to be sent to this conference, said delegations to be composed of the President and four members of each of the following organizations:

The Oregon State Grange, Farmers' Educational and Co-Operative Union, Oregon Federation of Labor, Portland Chamber of Commerce.

One delegate to be named by each of the following railroads: Northern Pacific, Great Northern, Oregon-Washington Railroad & Navigation company, Spokane-Portland & Seattle Railway company, Southern Pacific company and Portland Railway Light & Power company.

Oregon Development League, Oregon Drainage association, West Coast Lumbermen's Association of Oregon and Washington, Central Oregon Development League, Oregon Agricultural College, University of Oregon, Oregon State Press association. The governor of the state of Oregon and four delegates at large to be appointed by him. The president of the senate of Oregon and four state senators to be appointed by him. The speaker of the House of Representatives of Oregon and four state representatives to be appointed by him. Oregon State Bankers' association. One delegate from each of the following Portland daily newspapers: Morning Oregonian, Oregon Journal, Evening Telegram, Daily News.

Third: To make the necessary arrangements for this conference.

Fourth: To represent the Oregon Irrigation Congress as delegates thereto, and to urge the draft of the constitutional amendment and legislation favored by this congress.

Fifth: To urge, when the aforesaid constitutional amendment and legislation are drafted, that the conference take the necessary steps and perfect the necessary organization to secure the placing of these measures upon the ballot at the next general state election and to conduct the campaign of education necessary to secure their adoption by the voters of the State of Oregon.

Treatment of Frost-Bitten Combs
The season will soon open when there will be a good many inquiries

about treatment of frosted or frozen combs, says the American Poultry Journal. Birds kept in closed houses, and housed always in open-front houses are much less liable to frost-bite than birds kept in closed houses. Frost-bite seldom occurs when birds are in good condition. When first discovered do not bring the bird into a warm room—massage the parts first with cold water then with snow, and then when soft and normal to the touch, apply camphorated oil well rubbed in.

Duck Don'ts

Don't keep two or three different kinds of ducks. Choose one variety and breed for quality.

Don't try to raise ducklings on whole wheat, cracked corn or commercial chick feeds. If used at all, these feeds should be well cooked for ordinarily ducks do not consume enough grit to grind dry grain.

Don't try by mixing it with their food, to force ducks to eat more grit than they want.

Ducks should be fed four or five times daily.

Don't allow the feed to stand from one meal to the next and expect ducks to be satisfied with it.

Don't give ducks sour food; it is likely to cause convulsions.
