HIGH SCHOOL HAS TWO CONTESTS IN 3 DAYS.

Jefferson High Saturday and Enterprise Thursday Is Schedule.

Three big basketball games are to be dished up within the next week here. Each is arranged under heavy financial obligations and each promises to be a treat in an athletic way. Coach Reynolds of the high school will have a strenuous week-end for his team. Tomorrow night Enterprise high comes to La Grande and plays at the high school gym. This contest is the first inter-county game of the year and of course has a very material bearing on the Eastern Oregon championship.

Following on the heels of the Thursday game, comes Jefferson high for Saturday night. Jefferson is a powerful quint, a team that will make the high school get down to brass tacks, and although the dope sheet contains little of encouragement to the home squad, the game will not be over "until it is ended."

Following these two games, the College of Idaho, from Caldwell, Idaho, comes here to hook on with the M. I. A. quint. This, too, promises to be a magnificent game, as the Idahoans have cleaned up in their vicinity to a queen's taste. This game will probably be played in the Y. M. C. A.

With two heavy games matched for one week-end, the high school tossers, who haven't been through a real game this year, have something worth while on their hands. However, that lively ball will be played, and that the public should support the teams in these three expensive and first-class games, are at least two of the pertinent facts concerning the games now booked.

Just at present the interest is cen-

tering on the game with Enterprise for tomorrow evening and the local team is being put through hard workouts in order to be in condition for this game. With one exception the team is in first class condition and able to put up a game royal. That exception being the dependable Jimmie Rosenbaum who has re-injured his foot and will be out of the games this week. Jimmie received a severe injury to his foot in the Thanksgiving football game and a hard knock received in practice the other day has renewed his troubles. "Crackie" McDonald and "Lynn" Larsen are holding down the forward positions while Walt Bean the veteran is still claiming first honors on the center position. Capt. Huff, "Fat" McGinnis and "Skeet" Reynolds are fighting it out for the guard positions while Millering, Johnson and Adecock are proving their worth as valuable substitutes.

Whitman College, Walla Walla, Jan. 26.—With her first three inter-collegiate games won, Whitman feels that her prospects for the basketball season are bright. The difficult team from Oregon Agricultural college was beaten in a hard game by a score of thirteen to eight. The team from the University of Idaho came down last week to take Whitman's scalp, but retired with the loss of both games, by a score of 38 to 25, and 27 to 13. The Whitman team goes on its first trip through Oregon, playing in Corvallis on February 11.

The Pan-American Union

Pan American Union is the international organization and an office is maintained in Washington D. C., by the twenty one American republics, as follows: Argentina, Bolivia, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, Cuba, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, Guatemala, Haiti, Honduras, Mexico, Nicaragua, Panama, Paraguay, Peru, Salvador, United States, Uruguay, Venezuela. It is devoted to the development and advancement of commerce, friendly intercourse, and good understanding among these countries. It is supported by quotas contributed by each country, based upon the population. Its affairs are administered by a Director General and an Assistant director, elected by and responsible to a Governing Board, which is composed of the Secretary of State of the United States and the diplomatic representatives in Washington of the other American governments. These two executive officers are assisted by a staff of international experts, statisticians, commercial specialists, editors, translators, compilers, librarians, clerks and stenographers. The Union publishes a Monthly Bulletin in English, Spanish, Portuguese and French, which is a careful record of Pan-American progress. It also publishes numerous special reports and pamphlets on various subjects of practical information. Its library, the Columbus Memorial Library, contains 30,000 volumes, 15,000 photographs, 100,000 index cards, and a large collection of maps. The Union is housed in a beautiful building erected through the munificence of Andrew Carnegie.

Millions for Philanthropy

The Presbyterian church in the U. S. A. spends each year five millions on various forms of benevolence. Rev. Carl H. Elliot told his congregation Sunday morning of the results of this investment last year, says the Salem Capital Journal.

More than nine hundred new Sunday schools were organized by the Sunday school board and 300 dead ones were resurrected. 89 churches were reorganized from 8 schools that this board has organized in previous years.

776 young men were helped to get an education in preparation for the ministry and 600 old ministers were given a pension to make old age less hard, and 793 rainier widows were also helped.

Sixteen hundred colored boys and girls of the southland are studying in one hundred and forty schools supported by the board for freed men. He said that immense progress had been made in the last fifty years in the work among colored people for whereas then all the teachers were white, now all but 78 of the 180 teachers in the schools are colored.

The home board spent nearly a million helping weak churches in needy communities and for special work among immigrants. It is not generally known that nearly a million Mexicans are now in the United States furnishing a rare missionary opportunity. 3,000 Poles in Baltimore and thousands of Italians also challenge the faith and aggressiveness of our evangelists.

Nearly half of the five millions went for work on the foreign field. There is help in the support of 859 organized churches and 2613 unorganized groups and last year there were added to the churches of this denomination on the foreign field, 17,281 persons as many as there are people in the city of Salem.

This board supports 2074 schools in which there are 81,000 pupils twenty-seven times as many as there are pupils in the public schools of our own city of Salem.

One of these schools, Silliman Institute of the Philippines, has a capacity for 700 students and last year had to turn away 300 boys who applied for admission.

There are seventy hospitals under the charge of this same mission board and last year 700,000 persons received treatment from their medical missionaries.

This board's administrative expense is less than 7 per cent. Ninety three

cents out of a dollar given for this cause arrives on the foreign field and becomes active in promoting good in all of the fifteen countries. The cause remains the most fraternal and philanthropic institution in all the world.
