SEASON OPENS WITH VICTORY

JIM BURLEIGH, ENTERPRISE CENTER, HURT.

Taken Out of Game With Broken Nose—Game Good in Spots.

La Grande opened her high school basketball season last evening at the high school gym by winning a victory over the Enterprise quint. As an exponent of the great indoor game, it was only so so, but the season is new in these parts, and both teams showed flashes of what may be expected of them later in the season. Enterprise bumped against hard luck in the first five seconds of play when Jim Burleigh registered a head-on collision with Bean and sustained a fractured nose. He was sent to a repair shop down town, and though he was able to return to the high school building after the game, his usefulness as a player is gone for some time to come. The team will miss Burleigh sorely at Union and Cove for he is the cog that meshes with Ault at forward, and by the way, before we forget it, that man Ault is some pumpkin. He is rangy, feet of foot and possesses an eye like an Indian at shooting baskets. He was easily the star performer of the game. A total of 22 points he won, about all that Enterprise got. Enterprise's next best bet was Steel, as short as Ault is tall, but possessed of speed that makes the other players on the floor look like furniture vans in comparison. As a matter of fact Ault and Steel were the only men playing ball all the time. McDonald was La Grande's chief scorer, he dropping some woody baskets especially in the first half. His work in spots was polished. Neither have the La Grander overcome the tendency to hold, and Referee Peterson called about 18 fouls of this sort, 8 of which Ault converted into points.
