Engineer John Gardner has received word of the death in Seattle of W. J. Cooper, an engineer formerly of La Grande. Mr. Cooper came to La Grande in 1889, the same year that Engineer Jack Thatcher came here. He remained until about the year 1893. He had many friends among the old time railroaders and others in La Grande. He was about fifty-six years of age.

Peter Grant is here from Riverside. Since last summer Mr. Grant has had charge of track construction on the railroad extension through Central Oregon. Riverside is still the terminal for train operation but the track has been laid about eight miles further west. Grading has been finished practically to the upper portion of Harney valley and the rails will be extended the coming season. On account of the weather conditions there is nothing that can be done in construction work at present and Mr. Grant will remain in La Grande until the time when work can be resumed.

The Oregon Cattle and Horse Raisers' association which was to meet in Baker on the 8th has been postponed until May 1.

The roof of a shed on Garret Taul's farm, three miles north of La Grande,

caved in under the weight of snow yesterday, but no particular damage was done. Taul was in town yesterday to engage help in clearing snow from other farm buildings at his place.

TRAINS MOVING.

cast is for more snow tomorrow. There is no sign of rain or a break in the storm there.

The snow has stopped the street car service and the taxi cab service. The delivery sleds are drawn by four horses each and then trouble is experienced.

Several warehouses and other unsound buildings have collapsed under the snow. The Walla Walla implement company's warehouse roof caved

in and the old brewery warehouse has also fallen.

Walla Wallans are apprehensive of a flood when the snow goes off.

Roofs Collapse at Pendleton.
Under their growing burden of snow, many roofs, particularly of barns and sheds, have begun to give way and during the past 24 hours several have collapsed.

About 2:30 yesterday morning the roof of the City Livery Barn on Thompson street fell with a crash, practically the entire roof falling. This is the largest structure which has suffered so far.

At the Tullis dairy a shed gave way beneath the load of snow yesterday. At the county hospital the roof of the large shed gave way under the snow.

Dynamite to Break Jams.
For the protection of the Pendleton water system in the event that sliding snow from the mountain sides chokes the river at Thorn Hollow, Supt. F. B. Hayes this morning sent up a large quantity of dynamite. He returned last evening from an inspection of the intake of the system, having spent a day and night there.

He found the snow four feet deep at Thorn Hollow. Slides down the mountain sides were occurring yesterday, he states, wiping the hillsides clean. No damage has been done to the conduit but he fears that, when rains or chinooks come that the softened snow will slide in great masses into the river, blocking it and flooding the whole country there. In such an event the head of the pipe line and the gatehouse would be endangered and, it is to guard against this danger, that he sent the explosives up. As soon as the river shows indications of blocking up, the dynamite will be set off in the snow masses.
