Jack Munroe.

This photograph, taken somewhere in France, shows Sergeant Jack Munroe of the Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry, since the famous ex-pugilist has received his first wound. Jack fought with the famous Princess Pats in the front trenches in France and Flanders for nine months before he received a scratch. Now he is convalescent after a three months' siege in hospital, but is doubtful whether there is a haymaker left in his bandaged right arm. After his brief fame in Montana during his ring career Jack Munroe drifted to Elk Lake, Ontario, and became first mayor of that mining town. He has been with the Patricia's since the day in August, 1914, when the Princess presented the original regiment with the colors worked by her own hands. When he was wounded less than fifty of the original eleven hundred Pats were left in action.
